ASCS Sprints on Dirt Ready for I-96!

TULSA, Okla. (September 19, 2011) — With the Engine Pro ASCS Sprints on Dirt presented by ARP season winding down, the series makes one last stop atop the 3/8-mile I-96 Speedway dirt oval in Lake Odessa, MI, this Saturday night.

Only Hartford Motor Speedway's rescheduled King of Michigan event on September 30 remains after Saturday's tilt at I-96 Speedway.
